Dear Parent and AP Student:

During the week of January 17th I will be distributing copies of the “Advanced Placement Bulletins for Students and Parents.” This bulletin contains information regarding the Advanced Placement examination program for the 2011-2012 school year. I strongly encourage you to read this bulletin and then discuss the appropriateness of registering for one or more Advanced Placement examinations. Students who have had difficulty in an AP class should discuss with their instructor whether or not to take the exam.

The most significant reason for a student to take an AP examination is the opportunity to earn college credit, based upon the score received on the test. AP scores are scaled from one (the lowest) to five (the highest). Credit is generally awarded for scores of three or higher. It is important to note that individual colleges and universities establish their own criteria for awarding credit based upon AP examination results. If you have any doubt, you should contact that college directly or go to www.collegeboard.com/ap/creditpolicy which has information regarding AP credit and placement policies.

There will be a mandatory pre-admission meeting on April 17th for all registered students. Registration for Advanced Placement exams will begin **February 6th** and conclude on **March 16th**. Each Advanced Placement exam will cost **\$87.00**, and checks need to be made out to Antioch Community High School. If a student is taking more than one exam, you may write out one check for the total amount. All students must submit a registration form indicating which exams they wish to take. Checks and cash payments are to be made in the Guidance Office. You may also pay exam fees by credit card. Credit card payments must be made in the Main Office. Students can download the registration form from the ACHS home page (www.sequoits.com) or stop by the Guidance Office for the form.

In the event your student chooses not to take the exam, a refund minus \$13.00 (the cost of the exam itself) will be given.
