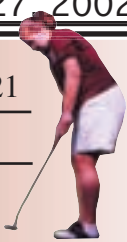

With only 4 minutes left, Antioch was down 3- to Mukwonago. Zac Highland scored on a penalty kick, which was followed soon after by another goal by Janke with only

two minutes left in the game. Janke pulled through again along with Enck, Highland, and Trulzsch who all scored
